



Harmony Day

On March 23, the College celebrated the diverse cultures represented in our community with our annual Harmony Day festival. The theme 'Everyone Belongs' aims to foster a sense of acceptance and unity within the school community, which is comprised of students from over 40 different cultural backgrounds.

The past and present traditional owners of this land, the Whadjuk people of the Noongar Nation, were recognised at the commencement of the festival and then, like last year, students were entertained by the Chinese lion dance performed by the Ging Mo Academy.

The festival continued with students partaking in numerous culturally-

inspired activities, including African drumming, Turkish belly dancing, didgeridoo playing, henna tattooing, turban head wrapping, American rodeo mechanical bull riding, Indonesian gamelan playing, boomerang and tribal face painting and playing with baby Australian farm animals.

An international food buffet, which included a range of delicious and exotic dishes prepared by students, staff and their families, was then enjoyed by the entire school community.

An international music concert of spectacular student performances proved to be an entertaining and uplifting culmination of our Harmony Day festival for another year.



Wayne Lyon Scholarship

The College is the benefactor of a major scholarship for students.

The Wayne Lyon Memorial Scholarship provides two students with a \$1000 scholarship each year. One scholarship is for a student who has an active interest in the environment in the Canning region and the second is for the continuance of education. These generous scholarships are available to Sevenoaks Senior College for 20 years. Recently, the two recipients of this scholarship were introduced to Mrs Tracy Lyon who presented each student with their scholarship.

The successful scholarship winners are Gobezie Adanew and Mary Macdonald.

For the second year, the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA) was administered to Year 11 and 12 students who have not yet demonstrated level three competency in reading, writing and numeracy. Results will be forwarded in the mail to each student involved as soon as they become available.



Achieving level 3 in OLNA or Band 8 in NAPLAN is a requirement for achieving a West Australian Certificate of Education.

Teachers have been working to prepare students for the tests including running special sessions on Wednesday afternoons, where Year 12 students could complete practice tests with support from English and Maths teachers.

The tests were designed by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority to measure the ability of every secondary school student to use their reading, writing and numeracy skills to the standard expected in the workplace. Level one suggests that skills need considerable improvement. Level two indicates that students are nearly up to the required standard and level three is the accepted standard.


College Ball


