

# Important Information for the start of the College Year

## SmartRider Cards

SmartRider cards are ordered for all new students on commencement and arrive early in Term 1. The cost of the initial card is free. All cards include a photo for identification purposes. Students need to go to the Library to have their photo taken and their card ordered. An opportunity to do this with their Advocacy teacher will be available in Week One.

Replacement cards can be issued at the cost of \$5.00 per card. Students are requested to pay this at the Front Office before the replacement card can be ordered.



## Uniform Shop

The wearing of College uniform is compulsory for all students.

Parents and carers can purchase from the Uniform Concepts Willetton Super Store. All new students are encouraged to make an appointment with the uniform shop for a fitting during Term 4, 2024, thus avoiding long queues in January 2025. ## Secondhand Books

Secondhand books are available to buy and sell through the Sustainable School Shop website. www.sustainableschoolshop.com.au

The website is an efficient way for families to be able to buy and sell second-hand textbooks and other student resources. It preferences our school first and then provides access to buy and sell items with families attending other schools. Access to second-hand textbooks, calculators and other resources is available all year.

Sevenoaks Senior College is providing this service to our community; when registering on the Sustainable School Shop you need to nominate the College to receive your subscription.

We also have an on-site secondhand store, 'Back on the Rack', which opened Term 1, 2024. The store sells textbooks, stationery items, uniform and a range of other clothing, shoes, accessories and home goods. ## Secondary Assistance Scheme

### Applications close 11 April 2025

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. For Year 11 & 12 students in receipt of the allowance, the funds will be applied directly to compulsory charges. The allowances below are available to secondary students providing the eligibility criteria is met.

### Secondary Assistance Scheme

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$235.00 Education Program Allowance paid directly Centrelink Health Care Card to the College and applied to voluntary contributions • Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card for Years 7 - 10. For Year 11 & 12 students in receipt of the allowance, the funds will be applied directly to Compulsory Charges.
- \$300.00 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/carer or to the College if you wish the money to be allocated towards College charges and contributions.

### Abstudy Supplement Allowance

### Late Applications

To apply for the SAS:

- Request an application form from the school in which your child is enrolled.
- Complete the application in full and provide the required supporting documentation.
- Submit the application to your school.

## Contributions and Charges Information

The following information is provided to help make the College contributions and charges structure clear for parents and carers. The Sevenoaks Senior College Board has directed our efforts towards keeping costs as low and as equitable as possible. The Sevenoaks Senior College Board has examined the Contributions and Charges structure and has approved the amounts shown in accordance with the Education Act.

### Who should pay?

Given that all students benefit from the pool of collected fees, it is fair to expect that all parents or carers should pay the balance of Contributions and Charges.

### A Compassionate View

The College is only too aware that the payment of College Contributions and Charges can be a burden for some families. Part payments and deferred payments are available to support parents or carers experiencing difficulties. Ignoring accounts and reminders is unhelpful to all parties. The College is also keen to assist parents or carers in selecting options that they can afford. To this end, course charges will always be provided to parents or carers prior to selection of courses.

### Collecting Contributions and Charges

The College will take a positive approach to collecting contributions from parents or carers of students. In particular, the College will highlight the benefits to students if all parents or carers meet their contributions. The College will actively seek full payment of charges:

- Regular statements and reminders will be sent throughout the year.
- Outstanding charges are rolled over to the student's record in the following year where applicable.

### Vocational Education and Training

Students participating in a Certificate through an external Registered Training Organisation (RTO) will be notified of their Fees and Charges Policy by the respective RTO.

## Where do Contributions and Charges go?

Some examples of expense include: ingredients in food production, art materials, timber, metal, consumable tools, external instructors, sporting equipment, etc. For Years 11 and 12 there are no maximum charges set by the State Government. Schools set their own charges for these years and such charges are compulsory.

### Year 11 and 12 Student Charges

All subjects costs for Year 11 and Year 12 students are considered to be charges and therefore payment is compulsory. Charges will depend upon the course chosen. Some specific courses will incur higher costs. These are due to items such as text books, subject specific resources, materials, excursions, certificates and work placement.

### The Legal Position

The State Government through the Department of Education provides placement at educational facilities for all students who choose to attend Government schools. The Department also pays for the salaries and wages of all teaching and school support staff plus costs such as repairs, maintenance and utilities. The Government does not provide for many of the goods and services which students use and it is reasonable for parents and carers to meet these costs.
